#### Teacher Development and Evaluation Rubric Alignment Info & Support, two options: February 21, 8am or 1pm

The teacher development and evaluation (TDE) statute has changed, impacting all Minnesota school districts and charter schools. The updated statute requires instructional frameworks to embed culturally responsive methodologies, aligned to the 2023 PELSB Standards of Effective Practice by school year 2025 – 2026. Why Mn MTSS? Over the years RTI was gradually morphing into MTSS, educators and leaders in Minnesota have worked to establish RTI/MTSS in schools. We know MTSS efforts have been in place in our districts and schools for many years, however in 2020 the opportunity arose to develop a Minnesota-specific definition and framework.

Minnesota Multi-Tiered System of Supports (MnMTSS) is a systemic, continuous improvement framework for ensuring positive social, emotional, behavioral, developmental, and academic outcomes for every student.

MNMTSS now encompasses 5 components: 1. Infrastructure for Continuous Improvement 2. Family and Community Engagement 3. Multi-layered practice and Support 4. Assessment 5. Data-Based Decision Making

# Regional Support Update As school advocates for the Northeast Service Cooperative, we

provide school improvement support to schools and districts identified under the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). We currently work with 21 schools in the northeast region. These include elementary and middle Schools, charter schools, alternative learning centers and online schools. Our work includes supporting administration, leadership teams and teachers to implement evidence-based practices to improve student outcomes.
